## Rubric for Reflection-Journal

- Level 4 The student reflects on the assigned prompt and relates it to the topic in great detail.

  The student explains his/her thoughts in a clear, logical and articulate manner. The student analyses the topic in-depth, using pertinent research data and real-life situations and examples to support his/her stance. Several attempts have been made to challenge assumptions at different stages.
- Level 3 The student reflects on the assigned prompt and relates it to the topic in detail. The student explains his/her thoughts and findings in a clear manner. The student analyses the topic through pertinent research data and/or real-life situations and examples. Attempts have been made to challenge assumptions.
- Level 2 The student reflects on the assigned prompt and relates it to the topic in some detail.

  (60-69%) The student explains his/her thoughts and findings in a somewhat clear manner. The student makes some analyses but uses superficial research data or real-life situations and examples. Attempts have been made to challenge some assumptions.
- Level 1 The student has difficulty reflecting on the assigned prompt and relating it to the topic.

  (50-59%) The student explains some thoughts and findings but is unclear and disorganized in presenting these ideas. There is an absence of research data and real-life situations and examples relating to the topic. Reflection reveals little or no analysis. There is no attempt to challenge assumptions.
